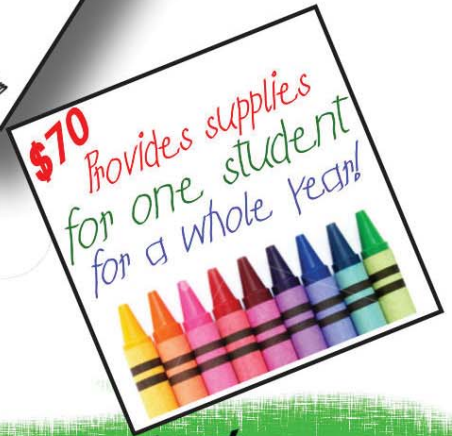

Letticia and Raul Cordero are just a few of the parents who can proudly say that they too have had the opportunity to attend New Hope Charities as children. Letticia relates that she had a lot of fun attending the program and remembers that the New Hope staff always helped with homework and planned fun field trips for them. What really stands out in her mind is that she was involved in many different activities. Letty remembers playing foosball and being really good at it. Staff would allow the children to play in friendly competitions which helped them to learn social skills. Raul says that he enjoyed playing football and being active in planning activities for everyone to enjoy. He remembers not always being willing to participate at first, but once he was given the opportunity to help plan daily activities, he liked the program even more.

Three of their five children currently attend the after-school program. Letty states, "I know that my children's grades are improving because they have the extra support of staff here at New Hope Charities." When the children are asked what they like most about New Hope Charities, one says, "the field trips," the other says, "being with friends," and the youngest says "arts & crafts and playing Duck Duck Goose!" Letty and Raul both agree that the Center has physically changed, but the staff and support for the children and families who are a part of New Hope Charities remain the same. They are planning to register their two youngest children in the after-school program as soon as they are able to attend school.

## New Hope News

- St. Mark's Episcopal Church volunteers assisted in revitalizing the Family Center with fresh paint for the classrooms and new mulch for the flower beds. General maintenance such as this helps to keep the Family Center looking fresh and welcoming for the kids that call this place their home away from home.



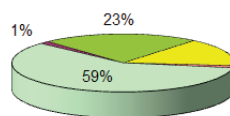
- In addition to the After-School Program, the Family Center is also utilized for the ESOL & Food Programs. New Hope offers adult English classes four days a week. Class instruction focuses on practical use of English in everyday life. The Food Distribution Program provides food bags to 193 families in the Glades who meet the federal guidelines on poverty.
- New Hope Charities teamed up with Bed, Bath & Beyond to distribute merchandise to local churches and agencies to give to the needy. Year to date, a total of \$118,314 worth of merchandise has been distributed.

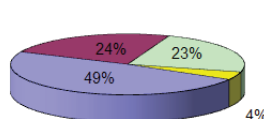

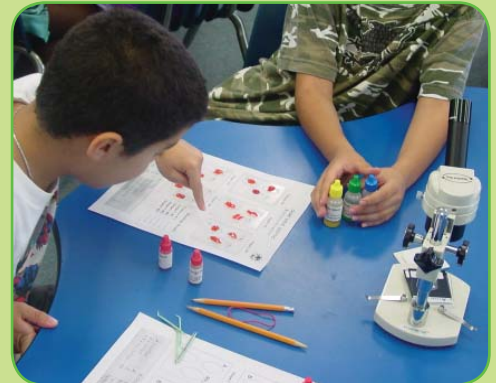

**Literacy:** Children are encouraged to read and all groups have scheduled "Reading Time."

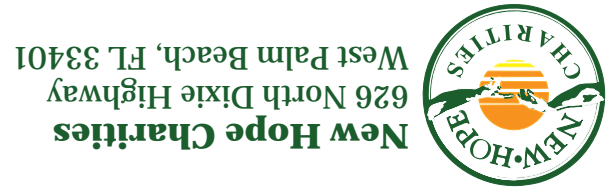


**Weekly Theme:** Program activities are driven by a weekly theme which includes topics such as Fire Prevention.
